

An Introduction to the Orchestra through Peter and The Wolf

<b>Listen and Respond</b>	<p>I would recommend watching the teaching video first and then finish by listening to Peter and the Wolf.</p> <p><a href="#">Introduction to the Orchestra Video</a></p> <p>Listen and watch Peter and The Wolf – there is a link to the Sunderland Symphony Orchestra performing this at Sunderland Empire Theatre. It has a lovely visual to accompany.</p> <p><a href="#">Peter &amp; the Wolf performed by Sunderland Symphony Orchestra</a></p> <p>See if you can spot the instruments of the orchestra we have talked about.</p>
<b>Join in and create</b>	<p>Watch the video where I will introduce the orchestra through characters from Peter and The Wolf.</p> <p>Fill in the <a href="#">worksheet</a> to see if you can remember the names of the instruments and which ones were used for the characters in the story.</p> <p>You can create your own sounds for the characters. For example, The Wolf is a scary character so you might want to make a loud sound to show he is dangerous. For the Grandpa, you could act out him walking slowly and see what sound that makes. (Put shoes on to make a better sound).</p> <p>Once you have sounds for your characters you could re tell the story in your own words, adding your own sounds.</p>
<b>More ideas in the theme</b>	<p>You could create a dance to the music of each character.</p> <p>Create a performance for your family. This could be a story of your own, with instruments you have made from things around the house.</p> <p>Draw or Paint your favourite character from Peter and the Wolf.</p>
<b>Adaptations for EYFS</b>	<p>Watch or listen to Peter and the Wolf.</p> <p>Talk about the sound animals from Peter and the Wolf make. Cat, Duck, Bird, Wolf.</p>
